Migration and Integration Policies

Description

This seminar aims to give an overview on (1) the different types of policies aiming at integrating immigrants, (2) their variation across countries and (3) their implications for immigrants' integration. We begin by critically discussing the construction of indices aiming at comparing policies cross-nationally. We then focus on six types of integration-related policies: immigration policies, citizenship regimes; State-Church regimes; civic integration policies, inclusive welfare policies and policies focusing on the inclusion of refugees. For each type of policies, we will first discuss ways of measuring these policies in a cross-national comparative perspective. We will then turn to studies that assess the effects of these policies on immigrants' integration. The seminar draws on contributions from sociology and political sciences.

The seminar welcomes doctoral students from across the social sciences. Students are expected to critically engage with all readings and actively participate in the discussion and in the exercises in class. As the final project, students will be invited to write a research paper based on and related to the literature discussed in class.
